Only 50 percent of the tooth is visible. X-rays are needed to evaluate the other 50 percent we can't see under the gums.

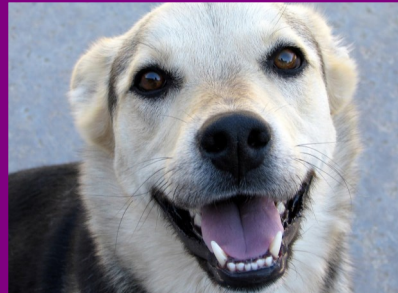
Many pet owners report their pets are more energetic after Oral Assessments and Treatments, because mouth pain has been resolved.

More than 80 percent of cats and dogs show signs of periodontal (gum) disease by age three, according to the American Veterinary Dental Society.



Contrary to popular belief, it is NOT normal for our pets to have terribly smelly breath!

The bacteria associated with oral disease can enter the bloodstream and serve as a source of infection to various organs, including the lungs, kidneys, liver and heart.
